Documentation and Works Cited Page Guidelines

Formatting a Works Cited Page

- 1-inch margins all the way around
- Works Cited written at the top, centered on the page
- Each entry uses hanging indent (1st line to the left margin; lines that follow indented ½ inch)
- Entries are in alphabetical order
- List only the entries for sources actually used in your essay—not those you merely read or looked at

Individual Citations

BASIC ONLINE SOURCE (without additional contributors)

Author's last name, Author's first name. "Source Title." Container Title. Sponsoring

Organization, publishing date, URL. Accessed date.

Tips to remember...

- * If there is no **AUTHOR**, skip it—begin with article title.
- * If you are citing the entire site, begin with the **CONTAINER TITLE**.
- * If the name of the publishing/sponsoring organization is the same as the name of the website, **SKIP IT—RECORD IT ONLY AS THE WEBSITE TITLE**.
- * If there is no publishing date, SKIP IT.

ONLINE SOURCE FOUND IN A DATABASE

Author's last name, Author's first name. "Source Title." First Container Title, version number,

issue number, publishing date, page numbers. Second Container Title (Database), URL

or doi. Accessed date.

Tips to remember...

* The database is considered the SECOND CONTAINER.

BOOK SOURCES

Author's last name, Author's first name. Title of Book. Publishing Company, Copyright year.

Tips to remember...

- * Most of the publishing information can be found on or around the **TITLE PAGE** at the beginning of the book.
- * Note that the title of the book is **ITALICIZED**.

Parenthetical Citations in your Essay

What word(s) do you use to cite your facts in the parenthetical citations in your paper?

- 1. If there is an author, use the **AUTHOR'S LAST NAME**.
- 2. When there's no author, use the **SOURCE TITLE IN QUOTATION MARKS**. You may shorten to the first few words only if it is excessively long.
- 3. When there's no author or clear source title, use the **WEBSITE/CONTAINER TITLE IN ITALICS**. This may be the case if you are citing an entire website—not just a specific page or article.

Helpful Hint: What you use in your parenthetical citation <u>should match EXACTLY the first item in the</u> <u>citation on your Works Cited Page.</u>
