

Research and Writing Searching for Possible Sources

Now that you are into your book a bit, you're going to take some time to search for quality sources with information on the topics you have been annotating in your book. You will not be required to use these sources when you write your essay; however, it would be wise to find sources that could work.

Directions: For each source, fill in the blanks in the "Source Information" column with the details you would need for a Works Cited page (use your notes to remember what #1-9 stand for). Then fill in at least 3 facts/details that prove this source is relevant to your topic(s) in the middle column. Finally, in the last column you will need to explain how these facts may connect to your book. **Note: Since you aren't finished reading yet, this may be an educated guess.*
